"I would try to persuade the chief executive of some huge utility company that they should take on offenders as they came out of prison, training them to see [the benefits of] this brilliant workforce," she explains. "When I came to run my own business, it just made sense to do it myself."

The scheme has been a huge success (one of Huntercombe's most successful rehabilitation programmes, according its governor), with Grimond describing her most recent employee as "one of [Nettlebed's] best cheesemakers ever. He came every day and worked really
